

# PROJECT OVERVIEW

## Project Fun Facts:

- Length = 3.9 miles of water line
  - includes 2", 6" & 8" pipe
- Will provide 294 services
- 39 fire hydrants
- Estimated project duration = 14 months
  - Contractor's schedule, project duration = 7 months
- Estimated Total Cost = \$3,241,843
  - Includes: design/plans, permit fees, construction, inspection
  - Breaks down to be \$11,027 per lot

# Project Status:

- Water main west of, and including, Forestdale Ave. has been installed.
- Services installed on Chagrin, Bravado, Coty & Rip



# Current Schedule:

- Now – mid February:
  - Install water main on 32nd St and Ironwood
  - Continue installing services west of Forestdale.
- Mid February – mid March:
  - Install water main on 33rd St and 34th Street.
  - Complete the services west of, and including, Forestdale.
- Mid March – mid April:
  - Install water main on 28th, 29th and 30th Street.
  - Install services on 32nd, Ironwood, 33rd and 34th Street.
- Mid April – end of May:
  - Install services on 28th, 29th and 30th Street.
  - Continue restoring the site.
- June:
  - Continue to restore the site and address punch list items.

# How Much Will it Cost to Tie-In:

- Canton Water Department Discounted Tie-In Fee:
  - \$500: If the property owner connects and establishes an active account prior to July 1st, 2021. Cost includes the meter fees.
  - \$1,500: If the property owner connects and establishes an active account prior to January 1st, 2022. Cost includes meter fees.
  - \$2,500: If the property owner connects and establishes an active account on, or after, January 1st, 2022. Cost does not include meter fees.
- Cost to run service into resident/business
- Cost to abandon well

## How to Tie-In (Abbreviated Summary):

- Pay the applicable tie-in fee at the Canton Water Dept. Engineer's office
- Acquire a Canton Plumbing Permit
  - A commercial building must submit plumbing plans
- Acquire a well abandonment permit from the Stark County Health Department
- Install the service from the curb box to the structure
- Have Canton's Plumbing Inspector inspect the installation
- Contact Canton's Billing Office to establish an account and schedule to have the meter set

# Common Questions:

1. When can I tie into the waterline?
  - Once your curb box has been installed.
2. If I tie in, can I keep my existing well?
  - Yes, but the well's plumbing must be disconnected from your water service.
  - You will be required to install a backflow preventer.
  - You will need to have the backflow device tested yearly by a licensed tester (approx. \$100).
  - \$100 = 12,608 gallons of water (@ 5 gal/min = 42 hours)
3. What type of material can I use for my service line?
