Do You Need a Smoke Detector?




Every home should have a working smoke detector on every level. Does your home have them? Canton Township Fire Department has smoke detectors available to our residents who need them. The department can also come to your home and give recommendations for detector locations and install the detectors for you. Tips to Keep Safe This Winter

Portable Heaters & Wood Burners

- Use kerosene heaters and space heaters according
 - to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Alternative heaters need their space. Keep anything combustible at least three feet away.
- Make sure alternative heaters have "tip switches," which are designed to automatically

turn off the heater in the event they tip over.



 Never refill a space heater while it is operating or still hot.

Make sure wood stoves

- Refuel heaters only outdoors.
- are properly installed, and at least three feet away from combustible materials. Ensure they have the proper floor support and

Ensure they have the proper floor support and adequate ventilation. Feel free to contact our Fire Prevention office for more information about stove installation codes.

Additional Tips

- Be careful when using candles. Keep the flame away from combustible objects and out of the reach of children.
- Make certain that your home has smoke alarms and they are in proper working order.
- Some smoke alarms may be dependent on your home's electrical service and could be inoperative during a power outage. Check to see if your smoke alarms use a back-up battery and install a new battery at least once a year.
- Smoke alarms should be installed on every level of your home and inside and outside of sleeping areas.
- All smoke alarms should be tested monthly. All batteries should be replaced with new ones at least once a year.
- If there is a fire hydrant near your home, keep it clear of snow, ice and debris for easy access by the fire department.
- Never run cords under rugs or carpets where heat might build up or damage to a cord may go unnoticed.
- Use a generator or other fuel-powered machines outside the home. CO (carbon monoxide) fumes are odorless and can quickly overwhelm you indoors





Road Levy Dollars At Work All of the 2018 road resurfacing projects have been Yard Waste Site Closing The Board will be considering at its December 18th

All of the 2018 road resurfacing projects have been completed. Close to 10 miles of township roads were resurfaced this year. Pictured above is a section of Faircrest ST SE that was paved and striped this past week.



The Board will be considering at its December 18th meeting closing the site, possibly as soon as December 31, 2018, or shortly thereafter (allowing for Christmas tree collection). This consideration is necessary as the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District explained in their recent newsletter (mailed to district residents) budgetary constraints will continue into 2019, thereby passing along more of the cost to run yard waste programs to local governments. Our yard waste site reopened in April and through November 30, 2018, Canton Township received \$30,814 in grant funding from the district against \$51,224 in total expenses. This cost includes

\$38,900 in removal container fees as well as labor, fuel, and other miscellaneous expenses



Winter Weather Update

Acquiring and storing road salt remains a major challenge for the township. The dilapidated salt shed continues to deteriorate and the road salt supply is expected to be worse than last year due to salt mining production. The Board authorized the Road Superintendent to proactively purchase 500 tons of road salt to be stored at the Lake Township storage facility. Thanks to Lake Township for their ongoing cooperative efforts.

As a reminder, a snow parking ban will be implemented when snowfall reaches 2 inches. All vehicles

All vehicles ad crews can safely perform necessary road maintenance. Vehicles not owed at the owner's expense. Announcements of the snow parking ban

must be removed from the roadway so that road crews can safely perform necessary road maintenance. Vehicles not removed from roadways are subject to being towed at the owner's expense. Announcements of the snow parking ban will be on made on WHBC, road department facebook page and the Canton Township email notification system.



ZONINGNEWS

Grant Funding Approved to Help Offset Teardown Cost

The board approved to sign a funding agreement between Canton Township and Stark County Land Reutilization Corporation. This grant will help offset the teardown and cleanup cost of 2630 6th ST SE.



Reutilization on Whipple Avenue



The Zoning Department applied for a grant through the US Environmental Protection Agency under the Stark County Brownfield Program to remove the underground storage tanks at 1652 Whipple Ave NW. Also, a \$100,000 grant was received through the Stark County Land Reutilization Corp to clean up this property.

High Grass Nuisance Assessments

In 2018, 195 letters were sent from the zoning department to notify property owners of high grass nuisance. 71 properties were mowed by the property owners and 124 were mowed by Canton Township. \$85,850 in assessments were placed on the tax duplicate as a lien. A total of \$52,197.19 was collected from previously assessed properties.

EPA INFORMATION



SAND / SALT MIX

STUFF

Road salt (sodium chloride) only works above 15°F. For colder temperatures use sand for added traction, or switch to an ice melting product designed to work at colder temperatures.



AMOUNT

Spreading more salt does not improve deicing. One 12 ounce coffee cup full of salt is enough to cover about 10 sidewalk squares. There should be about 3 inches between salt granules. Be sure to sweep up any excess salt.



LOCATION

Salt only belongs on your sidewalk and driveway and never on your lawn, flower beds, the base of a tree and definitely not in a stream! One teaspoon of salt permanently pollutes 5 gallons of water.



TIME

Salt works best when it is applied before the snow falls or right after snow is removed from your driveway or sidewalk. Never apply salt when rain is in the forecast, as it will wash away into our waterways.
